LAKE ALICE



POINTS OF INTEREST

- 1 A Center for the Arts**
Built in 1921 as the Orpheum Theater, the Center has 1100+ lights on its marquee and hosts over 60 events annually.
- 2 Great Northern Railroad Depot**
While the original depot now stands at the corner of Cavour and Vine as a residence, this station was built in 1898.
- 3 Lake Alice**
Although the identity of the real Alice will forever remain a mystery, the lake remains a favorite year-round attraction.
- 4 St. James Episcopal Church**
Rebuilt in 1922 after the 1919 cyclone, the bell from the original church is believed to reside in Lake Alice.
- 5 Union Avenue Railroad Bridge**
Officially known as “Bridge 5453,” this structure was built in 1938 and has historically-significant design elements.
- 6 The Federated Church**
A joint ministry of the Presbyterian Church and the United Church of Christ, the present Federated Church was built in 1920.
