

Minnesota Legislative Sessions Creates Opportunities for Improved Health

In 2008, the Statewide Health Improvement Program (SHIP) was supported by bipartisan efforts under Governor Pawlenty. The work of developing longterm solutions to address the human and financial cost of chronic disease in our state begun. Key partnerships were established and successes started forming.

Unfortunately in 2011, SHIP was cut back by 70% due to a down economy and this important preventative work was carried out by just a few local SHIP programs, PartnerSHIP 4 Health being one of them.

Because of the success of SHIP there is a move to once again continue the efforts statewide so that all Minnesotans benefit.
