



According to 2010 statistics from the U.S. Census Bureau, the vast majority of residents in Becker, Clay, Otter Tail, and Wilkin counties classify themselves as white.

American Indians comprise the largest racial minority in the region - ranging from 0% to 38.5%.

In terms of ethnicity, the Hispanic population ranges from 0% to 20.5%.



Data for American Indians reflect persons reporting one race only - American Indian and Alaska Native. People reporting Hispanic origin may be of any race.


